To whom it may concern,

Re: Confirmation of Patient Status and Prescription – Medical Cannabis

We confirm that the individual named above has been under the care of Mamedica since the 18th September 2023.

During this time, the patient was prescribed cannabis-based medicinal products following a clinical evaluation by Dr Jurgita Soriene. The patient is now under the care of Dr Imogen Kretzschmar. All consultations include a full assessment in accordance with professional standards and applicable clinical guidance.

As part of our standard clinical practice, prescribing doctors will advise patients that they are legally permitted to drive in the UK while using prescribed medical cannabis, provided that:

1. They are not impaired.
2. The cannabis-based medication has been prescribed specifically to them, and they can provide appropriate evidence if required.
3. They are adhering to the instructions given by their prescribing doctor.

If the above criteria are met, the patient has a statutory medical defence against the offence of driving with THC levels exceeding the legal limit of 2µg/L in the blood.

However, patients are also clearly advised that driving while impaired by prescribed cannabis-based medication is not permitted. They are specifically warned of the legal consequences of exceeding the THC limit, as outlined in Section 5A of the Road Traffic Act 1988.

This warning, and the relevant legal context, is documented in the patient's clinical notes at the time of consultation.

For clarity, the relevant legal framework relates to the lawful prescribing and dispensing of cannabis-based medicinal products by a specialist doctor. Provided the supply is legitimate, possession and use in accordance with that prescription are lawful. However, patients are reminded that controlled drugs should only be used as directed by the prescriber, and their ongoing clinical need is reviewed at each appointment.

Our clinicians cannot provide advice or act as independent expert witnesses in relation to this matter. Any legal interpretation or opinion should be obtained from an independent specialist in

pharmaceutical or road traffic law. We can, however, provide all the factual evidence that may be required to support our patients in these circumstances.

2. A copy of the clinical consultation notes, which include the recorded driving-related guidance given to the patient.
